

# CALL FOR SUBMISSION OF SCIENTIFIC PAPERS YOUTH 20 (Y20)

Brasília, August, 21th

## CALL FOR SUBMISSION OF SCIENTIFIC PAPERS

The National Youth Secretariat of the General Secretariat of the Presidency of the Republic, together with the Brazilian Presidency of the Youth20 (Official Youth Engagement Group of the G20) and the National Youth Council (CONJUVE), in the exercise of their powers, make public, for the knowledge of those interested, that the registration period for the submission of academic and scientific papers for the Youth 20 (Y20) Production Contest will be open from August 21, 2024, to October 20, 2024, according to the provisions of this Call and applicable legislation.

### 1. OBJECTIVES

1.1 The main objective of the Y20 publication of works is to disseminate teaching, research, and extension activities carried out by the authors and scientific knowledge in general, focusing on the theme of youth and public youth policies.

1.2 The specific objectives are: (a) to promote debate on Combating hunger, poverty, and inequality; Climate change, energy transition, and sustainable development; Reform of the global governance system; Inclusion and diversity; Innovation and the future of work; (b) to stimulate reflections on the five themes of Youth 20; (c) to encourage thinking about the role of youth in addressing global governance challenges.

### 2. PAPER SUBMISSION

2.1 Papers should be submitted in the form of an EXPANDED ABSTRACT and an ARTICLE.

2.1.1 The expanded abstracts must be at least three and at most five pages, including text, tables and/or figures, and references.

2.1.2 Articles must be original, based on empirical research and/or theoretical analyses, and must follow the formatting, length, and citation standards below.

2.1.3 Submitted articles, whether in Portuguese, Spanish, or English, should be between three thousand and eight thousand words (including in the main body the abstracts in all three languages, keywords, tables, illustrations, charts, notes, and references). Appendices and annexes will be excluded from the word count.

2.2 Only individual papers or co-authored papers with a maximum of two co-authors will be accepted.

2.2.1 Each author may submit up to two (2) papers, including those co-authored.

2.3 Papers will be accepted from young authors who are up to 35 years old at the time of submission.

2.4 Substitutions of files or corrections will not be accepted after the submission deadline.

2.5 Papers must be submitted by 11:59 PM on October 19, 2024, exclusively to the following email address: [y20@y20brasil.org](mailto:y20@y20brasil.org).

2.6 Attached files must be saved in .doc format.

2.7 Authorship information must be included in the body of the email. The subject line of the email should be "Submission of Paper - Y20," and the email body should include: 2.8.1 The chosen Y20 Theme;

2.7.2 A brief curriculum vitae of the author(s) (Full name, highest degree, educational institution, and other relevant academic information);

2.7.3 Electronic and phone contact information;

2.8 The Selection Committee will respond to confirm receipt of the emails submitted for review.

2.9 Papers may be submitted by young Brazilians or foreigners.

2.9.1 Submissions by foreign authors must be in Spanish, Portuguese, or English.

2.9.2 Submissions must strictly follow the formatting standards of this call and those of the Brazilian Association of Technical Standards (ABNT).

### **3. THEMES**

3.1 Papers must fall under one of the five Y20 Themes listed below, always maintaining a close connection with the main theme of Y20:

- Combating hunger, poverty, and inequality;
- Climate change, energy transition, and sustainable development;
- Reform of the global governance system;
- Inclusion and diversity;
- Innovation and the future of work.

---

### **4. FORMATTING AND STRUCTURING OF PAPERS**

4.1 The formatting of articles and expanded abstracts must follow the general instructions provided below.

4.1.1 It is recommended to download the "Expanded Abstract Template" file (ANNEX I) in .doc format for editing, available in the attachment and on the website <https://y20brasil.org/en/>.

4.1.2 Abstracts and articles must be formatted on A4-sized paper, with 3 cm top and left margins, and 2 cm bottom and right margins. The Times New Roman font, size 12, should be used, justified. Line spacing should be 1.5 cm.

4.1.3 The first line of the initial page must contain the expression "YOUTH 20," followed by one blank line, then the title of the paper.

4.1.4 Title of the paper: (uppercase, bold, centered, size 12. Leave one blank line).

4.1.5 Authors: (insert the full name(s) of the author(s), with the last name first in uppercase and bold, followed by the first name, right-aligned, size 12, followed by, on the next line, the indication of the Y20 Theme(s) for which the paper is being submitted. In a footnote, include the academic title and email address of each author).

4.1.6 Simple Abstract Formation: The abstract must be written in single spacing, size 12, with a minimum of 150 and a maximum of 250 words, and contain between 3 and 5 keywords separated by semicolons (;).

4.2 Footnotes, images, citations, and references must be carefully used, following the guidelines below:

4.2.1 Footnotes: should only be used if absolutely necessary. When used, they should be numbered using Arabic numerals (1, 2, 3, etc.), which should be superscripted at the end of the word to which each note refers.

4.2.2 Images, graphs, and tables: If tables, figures, graphs, and charts are used, they should be included throughout the text, accompanied by a caption and source. The title of these elements should appear before them, size 12, centered, and in bold. Captions and sources should appear below, left-aligned, in font size 11. Limit the use of images, tables, and graphs as much as possible (following ABNT standards).

4.2.3 The "author-date" citation system (Author, Date, Page) will be adopted for this call.

4.2.4 Direct citations exceeding three lines should be indented by 4 cm, written in Times New Roman font, size 10, single-spaced, and without quotation marks.

4.2.5 In the references, only works mentioned in the text should be listed, strictly following the current norms of the Brazilian Association of Technical Standards (ABNT). Special attention is recommended to aspects such as: i) references should be listed in alphabetical order, without numbering, with single spacing (left-aligned); ii) if there is more than one work by the same author, they should be listed in chronological order of publication; if there is more than one work by the same author published in the same year, they should be differentiated by letters a, b, and c; iii) the first names of the authors listed in the references must be abbreviated; iv) it is mandatory to indicate the start and end pages when referencing articles/chapters from books and periodicals.

4.3 All rules not specified in this call must follow the ABNT standards, and doubts should be resolved by the Selection Committee of the Contest.

## 5. SELECTION OF PAPERS

5.1 The articles received will be evaluated by the Selection Committee, which will consist of eight (8) members, including:

- A representative from the National Youth Secretariat (SNJ): Responsible for ensuring that youth policies are well represented in the evaluation criteria.
- A representative from the Y20 coordination team: Responsible for ensuring that youth policies are well represented in the evaluation criteria.
- Two representatives from the National Youth Council (CONJUVE): Focused on ensuring the inclusion of diverse perspectives from Brazilian youth.
- Two recognized professors and researchers: Specialized in the contest's themes, responsible for evaluating the academic rigor and innovation of the proposals.
- Two international experts: To provide a global and comparative perspective, ensuring the international relevance of the selected works.

5.2 The Selection Committee will evaluate the papers according to the following criteria:

- Appropriateness of the paper to the indicated Theme(s);
- Proper use of language;
- Originality of the paper;
- Adherence to the technical criteria of this call;
- Textual coherence;
- Logical flow of ideas;
- Critical approach.

5.2.1 The paper's adherence to the indicated theme(s) does not preclude the connection and dialogue with other Y20 themes during the development of the work.

5.3 Papers that do not follow the rules established in this call, as well as those found to contain plagiarism, will be automatically rejected.

6.1 Accepted papers will be communicated via email to the registered authors, along with the letter of acceptance.

9.2 The Selection Committee reserves the right not to modify and/or correct the submitted texts, notifying the authors of the articles.

9.3 All omitted cases will be resolved by the Selection Committee, in full exercise of its functions and powers.

#### **1. INTRODUCTION**

The expanded abstract must be sent by 11:59 pm on the **20th (twenty) of October 2024**, at the email address: [y20@y20brasil.org](mailto:y20@y20brasil.org). Papers with up to two co-authors.

The expanded abstract must have a maximum of five pages, and must be written in Arial font, size 12, justified alignment, 1.5 interlinear spacing body of the text, top and left margins 3 cm and bottom and right margins 2 cm.

Example of a short direct quote: it must be done in the author-date system, in which the source is indicated “[...] by authorship (author’s surname, responsible

institution, geographical name or title of the document) followed by the publication date and pages” (AMADEU et al, 2015, p. 79)

Long direct quotations: if in the normal font configuration the quoted text adds up more than three lines, the quote must be highlighted from the text with a 4 cm indentation, being written in Arial font, size 11, interlinear spacing 1, without quotation marks. Example:

It is certainly difficult to accurately measure the motivations of resisters. Feelings of rebellion, revolt, indignation, fear, an unhappy political calculation [...] or even the leftist experience and the aspiration for democratic freedoms. We point out how a possible answer to the question of motivation, the ethical imperative of resistance. The intertwining of the field of ethics with politics legitimizing the right to resist to state oppression when it does not legitimize itself and does not make use of democracy. The inability to be indifferent to what hurts conscience, and the need to be “men first place and then subjects”, suggested by Thoreau. (CAMARGO, 2013, p. 120).

## **3. BIBLIOGRAPHICAL REFERENCES**

This section must be written in accordance with the standards of ABNT NBR 6023/2002. References are presented in alphabetical order by the author's surname, in single space, aligned to left and line spacing 1.0.
